At Watling Academy we are part of the Milton Keynes Youth Council (MKYCAB), This is an organisation that was set up to work with Milton Keynes schools to enable young people to use their voice to change Milton Keynes for the better. The MKYCAB focusses on a range of pertinent issues to support the development of Milton Keynes for young people.

In Tutorial sessions this half term, students have been asked to support the MKYCAB by considering a range of potential issues and areas that the MKYCAB could become involved in. Students were asked to consider ten local issues and ten national issues that they would like MKYCAB to campaign for during the 2020/2021 academic year. Having watched presentations that showed the merits of each case, students were required to vote for one national and one local issue.

In our first vote as members of MKYCAB our students voted to tackle homelessness in the Milton Keynes area. As a school we have begun to develop our support for this issue through raising money for a local homelessness charity, the Winter Night Shelter. At a national level, our students at Watling Academy voted overwhelmingly for the provision of free university education. We were extremely pleased with the mature and responsible way in which our students engaged with this democratic process. We look forward to building our relationship with the MKYCAB to provide our students with opportunities to make a difference.

BEBRAS COMPETITION

Students in STEM lessons took part in a computational thinking challenge called Bebras in the week commencing 2^{nd} November 2020. The competition was aimed to raise the awareness of Computer Science in a fun and rewarding way. The competition involved solving problems using computational thinking skills. Students had 40 minutes to answer 15 multiple choice questions which were varied in difficulty.

Computational thinking involves using a set of problem-solving skills and techniques that software engineers use to write programs and applications. Examples of these techniques would include the ability to break down complex tasks into simpler components, algorithm design, pattern recognition and abstraction. Sets of techniques have been taught to as part of the new Computing curriculum which is being delivered to students at Watling Academy in Key Stage 3.

There were 8 students who stood out amongst the crowd and earned distinction certificates: Amelie Adams, Elisabeth Ajibola, Samuel Carter, Fechi Ejikeme, Jago Lawrence, Ruby Taylor, Camila Todeschini and Olli Turvey. The overall winner of the competition who scored 138 out of 200 was Khadija-Rehman Memon. There were also 5 students who should earn a gold certificate for receiving a score of over 130: Samuel Carter, Simina Geanta, Jago Lawrence, Khadija-Rehman Memon and Jenefa Repuri.

Back in September, Watling Academy was approached by the Parks Trust to support them, along with other Milton Keynes schools, in planting acorns as part of a wider tree planting scheme across the town. In total, 48 acorns were planted in pots by Josh, Lily, Malika and Olivia from 7JCY. These acorns have been placed in our staff room and have been nurtured by Mr Williams since September.

We aim to grow these acorns to sapling stage, which will take about two years, before they are then handed over to the Parks Trust to be planted in local woodlands. Thanks to the support of our students and Mr Williams, our acorns are now shooting stems out of the soil and are getting bigger each day. The last count is that 32 of our 48 acorns have solid stems growing above the soil. These trees will hopefully grow and flourish to long outlast us and benefit the future families of our current Year 7 cohort.

The next step for Mr Williams and our Year 7 students is to repot the saplings as they grow and to find a new home for these when we move to our main building in Whitehouse.

Meeting Update

Mr. Nixon, our Site Manager, has also attended and answered many questions about the sustainability of our site. 




Here are the fantastic House logos for Laine, Leyh, Marshall, Rutherford and Turing that will be used going forward.
