Dear Parents and Carers,

You will have heard plenty in the news over the last week about possible dates for returning to school, strategies for helping children 'catch-up' and changes to plans for holidays and length of the school day. Much of this is media speculation and based on rumour so I'd like to assure you that at Watling we will simply remain focused on giving the highest quality learning opportunities for the students after half term and doing our best to provide them with support and care, albeit remotely. Beyond that we are well under way in planning for welcoming the students back as soon as we can.

What is for certain is that the EARLIEST date that students will return to school is Monday 8<sup>th</sup> March, but I suspect that the government response will involve a staggered return to school, most likely with Primary pupils first so it may be nearer Easter before secondary schools are fully open. I shall be looking carefully at any announcements and guidance from the DfE over half term and will be exploring any way in which we can fully re-open as soon as possible, particularly given our context as a school with only one year group.

**No 'Live-lessons' week (22<sup>nd</sup> February - 26<sup>th</sup> February)**

The feedback from the Remote Learning survey told us that the rigid timetable of live lessons throughout the day was quite exhausting for some students and their families and that an opportunity to be a little more flexible with timings would be good.

With this in mind we have decided to run the first week back after half term (w/b 22<sup>nd</sup> February) with no 'live lessons'.

For each subject/set of lessons throughout the week there will be a recorded presentation by the teacher available alongside work set for the remainder of the time. This will mean that there is no need to stick rigidly to the times of the Watling day and will give students and families the flexibility to manage sharing of devices or work round parents working schedules. I hope you will find this helpful, although I know that for some it will be easier to stick to the normal times to provide a structure for the week. During this week students should complete the tasks set for the subjects that they would have in a Week A of their school timetable.

The recorded presentations and tasks for the week can be accessed via Teams and your child's class in the normal way.

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During this time, the teaching team will be working on curriculum development that will take into account the differences in teaching and learning and delivery of the curriculum remotely and allow us to make adjustments to help students on their return to school.

This is a crucial task to ensure that what we teach when the students return allows us to build on their learning from January and February and plan for addressing any gaps that have arisen as a result of learning remotely.

To allow them to focus on this curriculum review and planning, teachers will not be available on email during Monday to Wednesday but will be available on either Thursday or Friday throughout the whole day to answer questions or arrange a 'live meeting' to help with any aspects of the work.

You will also receive a telephone call during the week from a member of staff to check how the learning is going and to help with any issues you might be finding with organising or accessing the work. There will be no registration sessions during that week.

The 'Remote Learning' programme and 'Live lessons' will return to normal the following week – w/b Monday 1<sup>st</sup> March, including daily registration at 8:45am.
