Dear Parents and Carers

I am immensely proud of the fantastic attitude Watling Academy Students have displayed since returning from lockdown, they have truly 'hit the ground running'. We also appreciate the support of parents / carers in getting all students back to the Academy in this difficult time.

House Points

At Watling Academy, we always aim to recognise student achievement. Students will receive verbal praise, postcards and letters sent home. A significant way we reward students is with House Points. Students are given house points for a variety of reasons but mainly for working well in lessons and demonstrating respect, responsibility and kindness, beyond that of what is expected. When students achieve 75 House Points, they achieve their Bronze award, for 150 House Points they are awarded Silver and for 300 House Points Gold. I would like to congratulate all the students who have received their Bronze badges, you will have noticed these pinned to school blazers. Many of these students are well on their way to achieving their silver award, a special mention goes to Brenny Pearl and Summer Cattigan who have managed to achieve their silver badge already.

As well as receiving House Points as individuals' students also collect them for their House. At Watling Academy students become a member of one, of 5 houses Laine, Leyh, Marshall, Rutherford and Turing. As you have probably spotted these are all people who have made a significant contribution to Milton Keynes.

The house names were chosen by Watling Academy students as part of the induction process and the house logos below were produced by Ms Piper after students from each house completed a design brief exercise.



Throughout the year (including during lockdown), students have competed in a range of challenges, quizzes, and house-based tasks. When combined with the House Points students have earned for their House we have: Rutherford with 2287 points leading Marshall with 2285 points. All is still to play for with only 131 points separating 1st and 5th place.

<u>Uniform</u>

Watling Academy School Uniform

Girls' clothing

- 1. Royal Blue Watling Academy blazer embroidered with Academy logo.
- 2. A Watling Academy tie.
- **3.** Watling Academy senior Royal Blue tartan skirt **or** full-length grey tailored trousers (not denim, cord, canvas or leather). Skin-tight, stretchy or jean-style trousers, leggings, jeggings and footless tights are not allowed.
- **4.** Regulation plain white buttoned shirt with a collar. "Fashion" alternatives to the regulation shirt are not allowed.
- 5. Dark coloured (black/navy/grey) plain socks or black/royal blue coloured tights (plain).

Boys' clothing

- 1. Royal Blue Watling Academy blazer embroidered with Academy logo.
- 2. A Watling Academy tie.
- **3.** Full length grey tailored trousers (not denim, cord, canvas or leather). Skin-tight, stretchy or Jeanstyle trousers are not allowed.
- **4.** Regulation plain white buttoned shirt with a collar. "Fashion" alternatives to the regulation shirt are not allowed.
- 5. Dark coloured (black/navy/grey) plain socks.

Shoes

- 1. Shoes must be of a sensible design in black. Black "Sensible Design Shoes" do not include shoes such as Vans, any trainers or trainer-style shoes e.g. Nike Air Force 1.
- 2. Students should wear traditional, formal leather/leather-style shoes that look smart. Canvas shoes of any type and boots above ankle height of any type (including leather) will not be allowed. Shoes must be plain in colour without coloured trim or stitching.
- **3.** Boots may only be worn in extreme weather conditions for travelling to and from the Academy. Student's usual shoes should be brought to change into.
