Dear Parents and Carers,

As Her Majesty the Queen celebrates her 70th anniversary as our monarch, here at Watling Academy we have been reflecting on our  $1^{st}$  anniversary of being in the school on the Barrosa Way site. How quickly time flies and how things have changed during our time here with the Whitehouse community and the school developing at a very fast rate.

This half term has been no exception, with another successful and busy few weeks. Trips, charity events, challenges and competitions have all taken place, together with extra-curricular clubs, sports fixtures and tree planting, all involving a great many of our students.

I am absolutely delighted to report that we have successfully got through to the National Finals of the Spanish Translation Bee which will be held at the University of Cambridge; won a creative writing competition at the Westbury Arts Centre in Aylesbury, with three students also receiving high commendation certificates; silver and bronze awards being achieved in the UKMT Maths Challenge and after being nominated by our local community into a competition run by Frosts Garden Centre, we are now the proud owners of a Hornbeam Tree which was planted by some of our Eco-Committee students in honour of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee.

Our extra-curricular clubs are going from strength to strength, with sports fixtures being held and competitions also being entered into through others such as the Lego Club who entered the First Lego League virtual competition, winning 2 awards.

Some of our Year 7 and 8 students also attended a training course on Anti-Bullying run by the Anti-Bullying Programme and the Diana Award. They have now become Watling's Ambassadors, a great achievement.

Many congratulations to all involved. We are very proud of all of them. On 26<sup>th</sup> May, over 450 students went out on our first ever 'Trips Day' - Year 7 to Whipsnade Zoo and Year 8 to Thorpe Park. These trips were a great success, students were impeccably behaved and really enjoyed the day. It was a credit to Watling seeing both staff and students demonstrate our core values on our first ever full year group trip days. Therefore as it was 'National Thank a Teacher Day' yesterday, it is appropriate to send my thanks and appreciation to all the Associate Staff and Teachers involved for a job very well done in the planning and organising of these.

As we start to plan for the new intake of Year 7's in September, we have many things to look forward to in the final few weeks of this academic year, so I wish you a relaxing and safe half term break, enjoy the extra bank holiday and Jubilee celebrations and we look forward to welcoming all students back on Monday 6<sup>th</sup> June.

We are really pleased and proud to announce that our students did very well in the challenge, with 68 students being awarded a Bronze Award and 22 students achieving a Silver Award. This success resulted in 20% of our students being awarded and recognised for their achievements in the maths challenge.

Special recognition must go to our three students who managed to achieve a Gold Award. Those students were Ayaan Asif, Mikey Winterflood and Shreeya Machireddy.

Shreeya scored the highest mark in the school and will now progress to the next round of the challenge. We wish her luck as she completes this next half term.

### LEGO CLUB



Throughout the year, Lego club have been preparing for the First Lego League competition. On the 5<sup>th</sup> May, seven of our students across year 7 and 8 took part in the virtual competition. We competed against 18 other schools from across the country. The students had to complete several tasks including a robot game, presenting an innovation project and being interviewed about their robot. The robot game involved students programming their robot to complete several different tasks on a grid within 2 and half minutes. Their innovation project considered the use of Starship robots to transport medicines and the team did very well in answering all their interview questions.

The students were excellent and had a very enjoyable day. We were even successful in winning 2 awards. We were awarded the best robot design award and the best coach award. Both reflecting the fantastic efforts the team and the teachers involved have put in this year.

We are really excited for next year's Lego competition and look forward to being able to compete against other schools in person.

### **SPELLING BEE – REGIONAL FINAL**



Foreign Language Spelling Bee 2022

During this term, the winners of Stage 2 of the Spanish Spelling Bee have been practising translating and spelling up to 200 words in Spanish as part of their preparation for Stage 3 where they competed against students across the entire southeast region for a place in the National Final.

More than 3,000 students competed across the southeast with 42 taking part in the Regional Final. Students had to correctly translate and spell as many of the 200 words as possible in a minute. The students with the highest scores in the whole region were then selected to take part in the National Competition.

I am so pleased to announce that two out of three of the Watling Academy competitors were selected to advance to the National Finals at the University of Cambridge.

The winners of Stage 3 were Zaina Shaik, who placed 3<sup>rd</sup> in the region, and Liana Hayfron who placed 1<sup>st</sup> in the region.

This is the second successive year where we've had two students advance to the National Final.

Well done to both students - this is a huge accomplishment!

Also, well done to Freya Kyd who also competed in the Regional Final and did really well.

#### RECYLING

The Eco-Committee was visited by Sarah Spicer, a member of MK Council. Sarah spoke to the students about the importance of recycling as well as how to do it properly. She helped the Eco-Committee realise that, whilst there are things we are doing well, we can still make improvements. One of the biggest issues are the bins – it seems that some students at Watling either don't know which bin is for recycling or do not know which items can and cannot be recycled. The Eco-Committee have decided that one of their next projects will be to revamp the school bins making it easier to distinguish between them. They will also work on educating Watling students on how to recycle properly and help us become a more sustainable and eco-friendly school.





Here are some Recycling Rules of Thumb from MK Council:

- Update your recycling knowledge Just because it looks recyclable doesn't mean it can be recycled in MK
- If in doubt, leave it out If you're unsure if something can be recycled, leave it out of the recycling bin
- No food or drink at all should ever go in the recycling Rinse out containers as food, dry or wet, can ruin paper for recycling
- Make sure items are empty, clean and dry Wet and dirty items can spoil recycling while it's being
  processed
- Nothing else goes in your recycling If you're struggling with too much waste or aren't sure how to
