

## Message to Parents/Carers From Mrs Barford, Deputy Head

I extend Mr Bacon's previous welcome and say how delighted I am that you have chosen Watling Academy as your secondary school. I cannot wait to invite all students into school in September.

Whilst we find ourselves in very different circumstances, one thing has not changed. That is the importance of young people transitioning through to the next stage of their education. The excitement, the anxieties, the challenges, the thrills, all still exist, and I am absolutely determined to meet any challenges head on and give your child the best possible transition experience that I can at this time.

As you are aware, this time of year we would normally be putting in place opportunities for students to meet their new classmates, meet their new teachers and experience Watling Academy 'lessons'. Furthermore, we would normally have additional transition activities for students with additional needs.

With this in mind, I have already contacted every single primary school that a Watling Academy student currently attends. I have spoken to many of our students' Year 6 teachers and their Heads of Year. Miss Hunt Watling Academy Special Education Needs and Disabilities Coordinator (SENDCo) has also spoken to many primary school teachers and SENDCOs where appropriate to do so.

This means I have a wealth of knowledge regarding all students' work and experiences at their primary schools and I will use some of this to help me put students into tutor groups. I also have the personalised sheet that students completed and returned as part of our welcome pack.

I am aware that some students have returned to their primary school and I am working closely with primary schools to plan alternative transition processes which will initially take place virtually. I am also aware that not all Year 6 students have returned to school and I will make sure that all transition activities can be completed at home. I am confident that students will find our virtual transition programme helpful, and it will support them to have a smooth start at Watling Academy.

I am hoping that a limited number of physical transition activities including visits and meetings may still be able to take place before September on a priority basis for students with additional needs. We will work with primary schools and families to plan bespoke transitions on a case by case basis.

The student section to this newsletter will provide further information about our virtual transition process over the coming weeks and I remain hopeful that I will be able to visit some primary schools.
