Literature: AQA 8702 - combination of Paper 1 (Macbeth) and Paper 2 (Poetry)

2 hours 15 minutes

- 1 x Macbeth question
- 1 x poetry anthology comparison question
- 1 x unseen poetry section

Section A: Macbeth: 34 marks

1 x extract-to-whole task 30 marks + 4 SPAG

What to revise:

Key characters - focus on: Macbeth; Lady Macbeth; Banquo: Macduff and The Witches.

Plot – what happens and when? What connections can you make between key scenes? How do characters change and develop over time?

Themes – power; ambition; the supernatural; monarchy and kingship; gender; appearances versus reality. **Context** – King James I; the Divine Rule of Kings; The Great Chain of Being; the supernatural and witchcraft; religion; gender and power; tragedy and the tragic hero.

Quotes – key quotes for each character/theme

Section B: Poetry comparison: Power and Conflict: 30 marks

1 x comparison task (one names poem, printed in the exam)

Example task: Compare how poets present the horrors of war in Exposure and one other poem from the Power and Conflict anthology.

What to revise:

Key poems – The Charge of the Light Brigade; Remains; Bayonet Charge; Exposure; War Photographer. **You must learn quotes!**

Poetic terminology – verse/stanza; rhythm; rhyme; couplet; meter; simile; metaphor; personification; alliteration; sibilance; assonance; caesura; enjambment; onomatopoeia; anaphora; repetition; refrain; symbolism; dialect. Comparison – how to the poems connect/contrast?

Section C: Unseen Poetry: 32 marks

- 2 x unseen poems to read/analyse (shorter than anthology poems)
- 1 x longer analysis question on one unseen poem (24 marks)
- 1 x short comparison of methods in both poems (8 marks)

What can I revise?

Poetic terminology – verse/stanza; rhythm; rhyme; couplet; meter; simile; metaphor; personification; alliteration; sibilance; assonance; caesura; enjambment; onomatopoeia; anaphora; repetition; refrain; symbolism; dialect.
