What will students be learning?

Our school website provides information about individual subject curriculums underneath the 'Education' tab. This a summary of the sequence of learning across each year group, with a breakdown of key knowledge and vocabulary that students are expected to know and understand by the end of each unit of study.

Equipment for Learning

Students are expected to be fully equipped for learning to support the delivery of the curriculum as well as demonstrating our core value of taking responsibility for their learning. Students should have the following items with them for all lessons:

- Exercise book (if taken home)
- A range of blue/black and red pens
- Pencils and sharpener
- Rubber
- Ruler
- Glue stick
- Protractor, compass, and scientific calculator (essential for all Maths and Science lessons)
- Highlighters
- Reading book and school planner

Ready-made pencil cases with the above items (excluding a calculator) are available to purchase from the school at a subsidised price of £3.25. These can be purchased via ParentMail and collected from the Admin Hub.

How are lessons structured at Watling Academy?

Lessons at Watling Academy will include 'Dual Objectives', this is to identify what students will be expected to know and do, as well as the learning habit that students will be using during the lesson. There are a range of learning tasks during each lesson, which include elements of challenge, independent tasks, reading and assessment and feedback from their teacher. Each lesson will begin with a 'do it now' task, which may focus on recalling knowledge from previous lessons, and end with a review. Students are expected to arrive promptly at the start of lessons, ready to engage productively in their 'do it now' task.



Homework

Homework is an important part of the learning process, allowing students time to revisit their learning, reinforcing knowledge and skills developed within lessons, as well as enriching understanding beyond the formal curriculum. Most homework set this year will focus on knowledge retrieval-based tasks using digital platforms. Students will receive short online quiz-based tasks that enable them to revisit key aspects of subject curriculums, as well as providing instant feedback on performance and next steps. At times, they may also be set alternative homework tasks where appropriate. This could include (although not exclusively) reading based tasks, research or group presentation tasks.

How much homework will students receive?

All students across the Academy will be set homework from the week beginning 23rd September.

Support with Homework

We recognise that some students can find completing homework tasks difficult and may need additional support or resources to do so. To support students with completing independent learning, a Homework Clinic will run between 3.15-4.15pm Monday to Friday. Parents/Carers will need to book students into individual sessions. Due to limited capacity, students will not be able to attend the Homework Clinic if they have not successfully booked in advance. Information on how to book will be sent to parents in a separate letter.

Class Charts

We will continue to use Class Charts, an online platform, to set all homework tasks. This will enable students, parents and staff to monitor homework set, submit homework tasks digitally (as specified by individual teaching staff) and organise time by prioritising homework to be completed via submission date.

It is important that all parents/carers have a ClassCharts account. Students can be added to up to 2 separate parent accounts. If you have any additional questions regarding ClassCharts, please contact your child's Tutor. Further information will be sent to new parents of Year 7 students to support with signing up to ClassCharts.

Your child will receive regular feedback from their teachers, during lessons and in response to work that they have completed. We will continue to keep you updated with the progress that they are making in school through Parent's Evenings and via Progress Reports, which will be sent home three times during the academic year.

We look forward to welcoming you all to our Learning Pathway Evenings over the coming weeks.
