WORDS FROM MR BACON, HEADTEACHER

Dear Parents & Carers

In what is my final newsletter piece as substantive Headteacher at Watling Academy I wanted to take the opportunity to reflect on the last four years.

Watling Academy began in September 2019 with just one member of staff, me(!), and the process of further recruitment began a month later, the month we held our inaugural Open Evening at Denbigh School. At that point, no one knew the challenge that COVID would play during our first year of opening, on top of the difficulties our main build not being ready posed and us having to begin our journey at Fairfields Primary.

Since then, we have appointed over 130 staff, interviewed nearly 2000 candidates for jobs, increased our student numbers from 180 to 1500, as it will be in September, had a successful 'Outstanding' OFSTED inspection and embarked on a journey of firsts. Examples of these notable 'firsts' have included our first overseas trip to Spain, our first Sports Day, our first work experience week for Year 10, the introduction of our Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme, our first musical productions – 'Game of Tiaras' and 'Bugsy', appointment of our first House Captains and House Champions and multiple awards for 'MK Cycling School of the Year'.

Next year we look forward to our first set of GCSE examinations for Year 11 and beyond that the opening of our sixth form provision.

Each year has created another landmark but the success story has been how children from across Milton Keynes and beyond have come together to create a brand-new community in our school on this brand-new development. How, from nothing, the students have created an ethos and culture that highlights our values and aims and showcases the best qualities of humanity and society.

ROUTES INTO LANGUAGES: FOREIGN LANGUAGE SPELLING BEE

Regional Finals

Eliza G from Rutherford House recently took part in the Stage 4 National Finals for the South of England Routes into Languages Foreign Language Spelling Bee competition. The competition was held on Monday 1st July at the University of Cambridge.

Students had to correctly spell as many words as they could in Spanish using the Spanish alphabet. Reaching this stage is a huge achievement as Eliza was one of the remaining 90 out of over 17,000 students who started the competition.

Nihaal M, also from Rutherford House, took part in Stage 3, the Regional Final for the South of England of the Routes into Languages Foreign Language Translation Bee competition on Monday 3rd June at the University of Bath.

Students had to correctly translate as many of the present tense, immediate future tense and preterite (past) tense sentences as possible in a minute, into Spanish. Reaching this stage is a great achievement in itself as they were part of the last 57 out of the 4,056 students who started the competition in the South. Nihaal did brilliantly well therefore and did herself proud!

Miss O'Dell would like to take this opportunity to congratulate all of year 7s. Let's hope to continue this legacy with next years cohort.

Mr Williams wanted to pass on his congratulations to all of year 8-9. The high standard across the year groups is a key factor in pushing students to reach the school and regional finals. As the competition is open to Year 8-9, current year 8 students will have the chance to have another go next year. This will really help you learn key sentences in multiple tenses and be successful in Spanish. Good luck for next year!

INTENSIVE DAYS FOR YEAR 7 & YEAR 8 MANDARIN EXCELLENCE PROGRAMME (MEP) STUDENTS

To foster student interest and deepen their understanding of Chinese culture, Year 7 and Year 8 MEP students participated in Mandarin Intensive Days.

Year 8 students delved into the world of Chinese idioms. Working in groups, they brought to life the stories behind idioms like "The Farmer Waiting for a Hare" (守株待兔) and "Drawing a Snake and Adding Feet" (画蛇添足). Students not only practiced their language skills but also gained insights into historical contexts.

In addition to idiom stories, we organised a Chinese singing competition. The students' accurate pronunciation and fluency were impressive, showcasing their dedication and hard work. Another highlight was our thrilling vocabulary competition, which set a solid foundation for the students' studies next year.

With the introduction of China's 144-hour visa-free policy, our students embraced the opportunity to plan virtual trips to various Chinese cities. In groups, they created appealing PowerPoint

presentations, outlining their travel plans. The creative ideas were shared with the entire class, sparking high curiosity in exploring different culture.

STUDENT LEADERSHIP

Our Student Council has had a busy and productive year. At the start of the year, we introduced the new role of House Captain, two students from each House campaigned and were elected to this position which is the most senior student role.

The House Captains have led the House Representatives (class representatives), taken House assemblies, been involved in the bidding process for our school caterers and been involved in organising House activities ranging from Dodgeball tournaments to the House Fete.

Our intention has always been to have a student council/student voice that has a meaningful say in how the Academy runs, throughout the year we have gauged student opinion from a number of sources,

- ⇒ We run a student voice where selected groups complete a questionnaire and sit in a discussion group where they can identify strengths of the Academy as well as identifying improvements.
- ⇒ House representatives work with their class to offer feedback to the senior leaders in the Academy. Most recently they completed a piece of work on the clubs we offer.

Whilst we are unable action all requests from our Student Voice we are proud of the contributions our students have made so far in shaping how the Academy runs.

Feedback from the above has resulted in numerous changes from the way we organise staff at lunch and break times to influencing the content of staff training.

Two areas where I feel the 'student voice' was really heard was with the introduction of a Platinum badge to recognise the students who have made an exceptional contribution to the Academy as well as the amendments made to the uniform policy where students asked for the option of wearing the school blazer or jumper; after working with Mr Bacon this change was implemented.

Whilst we are unable action all requests from our Student Voice we are proud of the contributions our students have made so far in shaping how the Academy runs.
