Revision strategies and materials

Writing

Foundation: The writing paper will consist of 4 questions: Photo description, 40 words, translation into Spanish and 90 words.

Higher: The writing paper will consist of 3 questions: 90 words, 150 words and a translation into Spanish.

To prepare, use your previous CORRECTED writing assessments and written assessed tasks that you have re-written as part of DIRT tasks. Use your vocabulary sheets to help draft new sentences.

Practise re-writing sentences from them until you can do them from memory. Remember to practise re-writing these pieces of work at least 4 times on separate occasions in order memorise the information.

Listening and Reading

These will be full past papers. To help prepare:

- Learn key vocabulary: Highlight words on your vocab sheets that you are less familiar with.
 Practise re-writing the vocabulary until you can do them from memory. Remember to practise re-writing this at least 4 times on separate occasions in order memorise the information.
- Practise listening and reading activities on bbc bitesize from all three themes.
- Test yourselves on apps such as Quizlet or Duolingo.

 More generally, set the language to Spanish (with English subtitles) on any streaming platform.
